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CHAPTER 23-07.6 COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONFINEMENT PROCEDUR

23-07.6-01. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

- "Communicable disease" means a disease or condition that caus serious disability, or death, the infectious agent of which may p directly or indirectly, from the body of one person to the body of ano
- "Confinement" means guarantine or isolation.
- "Isolation" means the physical separation and restrictions on movel individual or groups of individuals who are infected or reasona infected with a contagious or possibly contagious disease from noni to prevent or limit the transmission of the disease to nonisolated ind
- 4. "Local board" means a board of health as defined under section 23-
- 5. "Local health officer" means the health officer of a local board.
- "Quarantine" means the physical separation and restrictions on mc an individual or groups of individuals, who are or may have b contagious or possibly contagious disease and who do not show sig a contagious disease, from nonquarantined individuals to pre transmission of the disease to nonquarantined individuals.
- "Respondent" means the person or group of persons ordered restricted under this chapter.

23-07.6-02. Confinement order - Penalty.

- The state health officer or any local health officer may order any p
 confinement by a written directive if there are reasonable grounds
 person or group is infected with any communicable disease, the sta
 local health officer determines that the person or group poses a s
 the public health, and confinement is necessary and is the least re
 to protect or preserve the public health.
- Conditions and principles. The state or local health officer shall adh conditions and principles when isolating or quarantining individ individuals:
 - Isolation and quarantine must be by the least restrictive m prevent the spread of a contagious or possibly contagious dis may include confinement to private homes or other private and
 - Isolated individuals must be confined separately from quarantin
 - c. The health status of isolated and quarantined individuals r regularly to determine if they require isolation or quarantine.
 - d. If a quarantined individual subsequently becomes infected believed to have become infected with a contagious or p disease the individual must promptly be removed to isolation.
 - Isolated and quarantined individuals must be immediately repose no substantial risk of transmitting a contagious or p disease to others.
 - f. The needs of persons isolated and quarantined must be systematic and competent fashion, including providing adequately, means of communication with those in isolation or quatthese settings, medication, and competent medical care.

- g. Premises used for isolation and quarantine must be mainta hygienic manner and be designed to minimize the lik transmission of infection or other harm to persons isolated and
- To the extent possible, cultural and religious beliefs must addressing the needs of individuals and establishing and m and quarantine premises.

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
