## 2021 Oregon Revised Statutes Volume : 12 - Public Health Chapter 431 - State and Local Administration and Enforcement of Public Health Laws Section 431.142 - Communicable disease control programs.

Universal Citation: OR Rev Stat § 431.142 (2021)

Communicable disease control programs established under ORS 431.141 must identify, prevent and control infectious diseases that pose a threat to the health of the public and must include, but are not limited to:

(1) Recognizing, identifying and responding to communicable disease outbreaks;

(2) Maintaining a list of communicable diseases;

(3) Conducting, receiving and analyzing laboratory results and physician reports related to communicable diseases;

(4) Providing the support necessary for individuals to recognize communicable diseases and other illnesses of public health importance; and

(5) Conducting community-based programs for the purpose of preventing communicable diseases. [2015 c.736 §18]
